The TRAPS Tex-ternship Program enables outstanding young professionals 30 years of age and younger in the parks and recreation field to network with and learn from members of the Texas Recreation and Park Society (TRAPS) and others who attend the TRAPS Institute and its associated meetings. Up to four (4) Tex-terns are selected each year.

Tex-terns are paired with TRAPS members who serve as mentors during the Institute and may attend selected meetings, socials and educational sessions with their mentors or on their own. Mentors introduce Tex-terns to their contacts and expand the young professionals' networks. After the Institute, Tex-terns must write a brief evaluation report including:

- 1) an overview of activities they were involved in during the Institute
- 2) what they have gained from the program;
- 3) strengths and weaknesses of the program, including suggestions for improvement.
